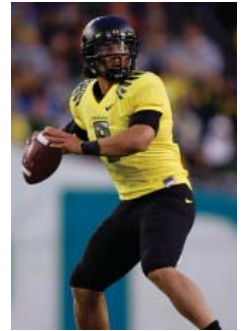

ONE TO WATCH

Starting with his leading of a fourth-quarter comeback win over Stanford in 2008, JR QB **Jeremiah Masoli** has solidified himself as one of the top players in the Pac-10 conference, going 10-1 overall and 7-0 as a starter in conference play. So far in 2009, Masoli is the most efficient passer in the Pac-10 (conference games), with a rating of 156.9. He enters Saturday's game 54 yards shy of equalling **Dennis Dixon's** school mark for career rushing yards by a QB (1,208).



GAME TIME

Kickoff is scheduled for 12:41 p.m. PT at Stanford Stadium with a live regional telecast on FSN. A live radio broadcast will be available across the Oregon Sports Network and on XM 194 and Sirius 217.

THE SERIES

- Stanford leads the all-time series with Oregon, 43-28-1, including a 27-13-1 advantage at home.
- The Ducks have a seven-game winning streak against the Cardinal, their longest current streak against a Pac-10 opponent.
- UO has won the past three meetings at Stanford Stadium, dating to 2004.

QUICK HITS

- The Ducks are 5-0 in Pac-10 play for the first time since 2000 and only the second time in 52 seasons.
- Oregon's average margin of victory in conference games is an even 30 (41.6-11.6).
- UO's current seven-game winning streak is one shy of the single-season school record of eight, accomplished in 1933 and 2000.
- Oregon has scored 40 or more points in all four Pac-10 starts by JR QB **Jeremiah Masoli** this season.
- FR RB **LaMichael James** is averaging 137.6 rushing yards per game in Pac-10 play, which is tops in the conference. His average of 7.4 yards per carry in those contests is second only to his teammate Masoli (7.5) among the leaders.
- Stanford SR RB **Toby Gerhart** is the Pac-10's top rusher overall with an average of 124.2 yards per game.
- The game will feature two of the top six kick returners in the nation in UO FR RB **Kenjon Barner** (5th, 35.36 avg.) and Stanford SO WR **Chris Owusu** (6th, 35.16).

All interview requests for players and coaches require 24 hours notice and must go through the media services office. Interviews will take place during a 15-minute window at the conclusion of each practice. No player interviews will be granted on the day before a game.

THURMOND OUT FOR YEAR

Preseason All-America **Walter Thurmond III** will miss the remainder of the season after suffering a knee injury on the opening kickoff vs. Cal (Sept. 26). The senior cornerback got off to a great start in 2009 and played instrumental roles in wins over Purdue (Sept. 12) and Utah (Sept. 19), returning an interception and punt return for touchdowns in those two games, respectively. The four-year starter posted 17 tackles in three appearances this year in addition to being ranked second in the Pacific-10 Conference (16th nationally) in punt returns (15.0 avg.) and third in the league in kickoff returns (27.7 avg.).

GLASPER DONE DUE TO KNEE

SR CB **Willie Glasper** will miss the remainder of the year after suffering a season-ending knee injury during a non-contact drill during practice Oct. 6. The Pittsburg, Calif., native had evolved into a special teams standout and solid reserve defensive back the past two years while earning one starting assignment prior to the start of the 2009 season. The three-year letterman had assumed the starting cornerback role in place of the injured **Walter Thurmond III**, who is also lost for the season with a knee injury. Glasper had recorded 11 tackles in five games this season, including 1.5 tackles of loss.

BLOUNT SUSPENDED

SR RB **LeGarrette Blount** is under an indefinite suspension following his involvement in a post-game incident after Oregon's 19-8 loss at Boise State on Sept. 3. Head coach **Chip Kelly** has allowed Blount to remain on scholarship as a member of the school's football program for the rest of the year, and will consider the possibility of reinstatement if the Perry, Fla., native meets certain criteria. Since his suspension, Blount has continued to practice with the team as a member of the scout team. Blount rushed for 1,002 yards a year ago and established a school record with 17 rushing touchdowns.

7-1 STARTS

Oregon is 7-1 to start the season for the seventh time in program history and third time in five years. The Ducks last began the year 7-1 in 2007, eventually extending the string to 8-1 before losing quarterback **Dennis Dixon** to a season-ending knee injury.

BOWL ELIGIBLE

The Ducks became the first team in the Pac-10 to become bowl eligible in 2009, a feat they accomplished for the fifth straight year. Oregon has been to 16 bowls in the past 20 seasons, the eighth-most appearances in college football over that time span.

ROOKIE BOWLER

Chip Kelly will join the man he succeeded as UO's head coach - Mike Bellotti - as the only men to lead the Ducks to a bowl game in their first year at the helm of the program.

LIGHTS OFF DEFENSE

UO's new morning practice regimen for 2009 appears to be paying off in early kickoffs. Oregon has played four day games - all starting at 12:30 p.m. PT - and has won each of them by an average of 21 points. In those contests, the defense is allowing just 14 points and 277.5 yards per game. In three night games, the Ducks margin of victory shrinks to 16 with UO surrendering 20.2 points and 324.2 yards per contest.

BCS STANDINGS

The Ducks enter this week's action ranked No. 8 in the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) standings. The appearance in the rankings is Oregon's 48th all-time, which ranks 13th among all schools in the history of the BCS standings. UO is the only Pac-10 school other than USC (T6th, 60) on the list. Final BCS standings and teams selected for games will be announced on Dec. 6.

EUGENE FIVE-0

The Ducks are 5-0 in Pac-10 play for only the second time (2000) since the conference's current configuration began play in 1978, and second time in overall league play in 52 years. All told, UO has started the conference season with five straight wins four times: 1948, '57, 2000, '09.

GOING POLLING

Oregon moved up to No. 7 in the AP top 25 this week - the Ducks highest ranking of the season. UO is currently eighth in the USA Today (coaches), and Harris polls, as well as the BCS rankings.

TOP OF THE PAC

Five games into the Pac-10 slate, Oregon's prowess on both sides of the ball in conference play has been stellar. The Ducks lead the conference (league games only) in 17 of 23 statistical categories, including scoring offense (41.6 ppg), scoring defense (11.6 ppg), total offense (474.0 ypg), total defense (259.6 ypg) and rushing offense (285.0 ypg). They are also the best pass defending team (155.8 ypg, 85.4 effic.).

AMONG THE FBS LEADERS

FR RB **Kenjon Barner** ranks fifth in kickoff returns (35.36) ... FR RB **LaMichael James** is 15th in rushing average at 114.75 yards per game ... SR PK **Morgan Flint** is 15th in scoring with 8.86 points per game ... JR DE **Kenny Rowe** is tied for 17th in the nation in sacks per game at 0.88. As a team, UO is third nationally in kickoff returns (29.79), fourth in pass efficiency defense (94.88), eighth in rushing offense (233.25), ninth in scoring offense (35.63), 11th in sacks (3.00), 19th in scoring defense (17.13) and 20th in total defense (300.88).

TD MACHINE

With another rushing touchdowns vs. USC Oct. 31, JR QB **Jeremiah Masoli** leads the team with eight on the year. The Bay Area native has rushed for at least one score in 12 of his last 14 games and has 18 career TDs in 19 games as a Duck.

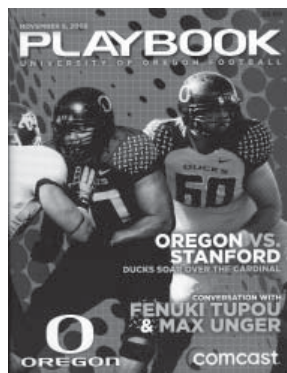

THE MAGNIFICENT 11

Thanks in large part to a tremendous effort from all 11 defensive positions in wins over Cal (Sept. 26), Washington State (Oct. 3) and UCLA (Oct. 10), Oregon held three consecutive opponents to less than ten points for the first time since 1980.

MASOLI CLOSING IN ON QB RUSHING MARK

With 164 rushing yards vs. USC Oct. 31, JR QB **Jeremiah Masoli** eclipsed 1,000 for his Oregon career, running his total to 1,154. The Californian trails fellow Bay Area native **Dennis Dixon** by 54 yards for the most rushing yards by a quarterback in UO history. Dixon amassed 1,208 yards between 2004 and 2007. **Reggie Ogburn** (1979-80) ranks second on the list with 1,171.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) — LeGarrette Blount's 3-yard touchdown run with six seconds left gave Oregon a 35-28 victory over Stanford on Saturday.

Down 28-27 when Stanford scored with 2:18 left, Oregon efficiently drove the field—a series highlighted by quarterback Jeremi-

ah Masoli's 25-yard carry—and left no time for Stanford to answer after making the two-point conversion.

Masoli completed 11 of 21 passes for 144 yards and a touchdown for Oregon (6-4, 5-2 Pac-10), while Blount ran for 90 yards and two scores.

Stanford (5-5, 4-3) remained in need of one more victory to become bowl eligible for the first time since 2001. The Cardinal close out with USC at home before visiting California.

Cardinal running back Toby Gerhart, who was injured for all but one game last season, is closing in on becoming Stanford's first 1,000-yard rusher since Tommy Vardell in 1991.

But Gerhart injured his upper right hamstring early in the game and finished with eight carries for 21 yards, giving him 931 yards for the season.

Tavita Pritchard completed 15 of 22 passes for 138 yards and a TD for Stanford.

With conditions alternating from sudden downpours to bursts of brilliant sunshine, Oregon went ahead early on Morgan Flint's 37-yard field goal and Masoli's 5-yard touchdown pass to Jeff Maehl.

After Stanford's Aaron Zagory converted a 39-yard field goal attempt to make it 10-3, Jeremiah Johnson ran 41 yards to score for Oregon.

Pritchard found Josh Catron with a 5-yard scoring pass to narrow it to 17-10 for Stanford. The Cardinal tied it with a fake field goal, when holder Bo McNally ran eight yards for the score.

Oregon pulled ahead before halftime with Flint's 26-yard field goal.

Zagory had a 20-yard field goal to tie it again after the break. But Oregon answered with Blount's 38-yard touchdown run in pouring rain to take a 27-20 lead.

LOCKED IN

SR TE **Ed Dickson** has scored a career-high four touchdowns this season, accounting for all but two passing TDs thrown by JR QB **Jeremiah Masoli**.

FAST START

Chip Kelly's seven-game winning streak is the most by a first-year head coach at Oregon since **C.W. Spears** won seven straight to start the 1930 season. Kelly's 5-0 home mark to start a coaching career is also the best record since Spears won his first seven home games from 1930 to '31.

ANOTHER TFL FOR TUKUAFU

SR DE **Will Tukuafu** is now ranked among the top 10 players in UO history when it comes to tackles for loss. With 6.5 on the season, Tukuafu has 32.5 in his three-year career to rank ninth. He recently passed current graduate assistant coach **Peter Sirmon** (1996-99), who had 32.0 TFLs as an Oregon linebacker.

NOT SO FAST, MY FRIEND...

Former coach and current ESPN College GameDay analyst **Lee Corso's** catch phrase could be directed at the Davey O'Brien award folks after they left JR QB **Jeremiah Masoli** off their list of 15 semifinalists released Oct. 26. In consecutive weeks, Masoli has out dueled Washington's **Jake Locker** and USC's **Matt Barkley**, both semifinalists for the prestigious award. Since Week 4, no Pac-10 quarterback stacks up to Masoli from an efficiency standpoint. From Sept. 26 to present, the former City College of San Francisco standout is completing 70.8 percent of his passes (68 of 96) with six touchdowns against zero interceptions. He's averaging 72.8 yards rushing per game over that stretch (7.5 per carry), with four TDs, while totaling 259.8 yards of offense per contest.

MASOLI NAMED WALTER CAMP POTW

JR QB **Jeremiah Masoli** was named national offensive player of the week by the Walter Camp Football Foundation for Week 10 of the college football season, after leading the Ducks to a 47-20 blowout win of then-No. 4 USC. A preseason all-conference choice, Masoli totaled 386 yards of offense and two touchdowns (1 rush, 1 pass). He orchestrated an attack that produced 613 yards - the second-highest total ever allowed by the Trojans behind Notre Dame's 623 yards in 1946.

FOR THE RECORD

Oregon's 47-20 win over USC on Halloween was the kind of result neither program had ever experienced in 55 prior meetings:
 •It was the Ducks' most points ever against the Trojans, as well as the most points scored against USC since UCLA had 48 in 2 overtimes

in 1996.

- It was also Troy's largest losing deficit since a 27-point loss to Washington in 1997.
- Oregon gained 613 total yards, the second most ever against USC (behind Notre Dame's 623 in 1946), and ran for 391 yards (the most since Texas A&M had 486 in the 1977 Bluebonnet Bowl).
- Oregon's 31 first downs were the most against Troy since UCLA had a USC opponent record-tying 32 in 1970.
- The Ducks did this against a USC defense that was allowing just 291.7 total yards (including 79.9 rushing, fifth in the nation) and 15.1 points.
- It also snapped USC's 10-game winning streak against AP top 25 opponents.
- It was the most first half points surrendered by USC since Stanford had 28 in 2004.

JAMES NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

FR RB **LaMichael James** was named the Pac-10 offensive player of the week, following his 183-yard rushing performance in UO's 47-20 win over No. 4 USC. James carried 24 times, scored a touchdown and set a new UO single-game freshman standard with his game-high rushing total. He became the third Duck to take home a conference honor this season, joining SR TE **Ed Dickson** (offense, Week 4) and FR RB **Kenjon Barner** (special teams, Week 6).

JAMES SETS RUSHING MARK

In his third career appearance and first career start, FR RB **LaMichael James** rushed for more yards in a single game - 152 on Sept. 19 vs. Utah - than any freshman in UO school history. His total broke **Sean Burwell's** (1990-93) mark of 144 vs. Stanford in 1990 and was the most by a frosh since **Terrence Whitehead** (2002-05) ran for 132 yards against the Cardinal in 2002. He has since established a new mark, running for 183 yards vs. USC (Oct. 31).

GET ON LA MIKE

Only four games into his career, FR RB **LaMichael James** became the 29th player in school history to record multiple 100-yard rushing games, when he followed up 152 yards vs. Utah (Sept. 19) with 118 vs. Cal (Sept. 26). James is now on a streak of three games with 100-plus yards - 152 yards at UCLA (Oct. 10), 154 at Washington (Oct. 24) and 183 vs. USC (Oct. 31) - and has tied the UO record for 100-yard performances by a freshman in a single season, set by **Sean Burwell** with five in 1990.

THE PLAYMAKER

SO TE **David Paulson** has a modest season total of 10 catches, but nine have been for first downs. UO has scored on nine of the 10 drives in which he has a reception.

MORE ON JAMES

FR RB **LaMichael James** is averaging 140.0 yards in six games since becoming a starter and has 918 yards overall to rank second all-time on UO's freshman rushing list. For comparison sake, **Jonathan Stewart** (2005) had 188 yards and **Jeremiah Johnson** (2005) 147 during their freshman seasons.

SPREAD DEFENSE

Oregon's spread offense has garnered plenty of attention over the past few seasons, but 2009 is looking like the year of the spread defense for the Ducks. In the win over No. 6 California Sept. 26, the Ducks had 19 players record two or more tackles, with no one player making more than five. In a similar effort vs. Washington Oct. 24, 17 players had multiple stops with no one Duck registering more than seven.

STREAK BUSTERS

The Ducks ended the nation's longest active winning streak at 16 games, when they defeated then-No. 18 Utah, 31-24, on Sept. 19. It was the Utes first loss since Nov. 24, 2007, at BYU. The following week, UO snapped Cal's Pac-10 best six game streak (all games).

DICKSON NAMED NAT'L POTW

SR TE **Ed Dickson** was named national offensive player of the week by the Walter Camp Football Foundation for Week 4 of

the college football season, following his performance vs. Cal (Sept. 26). The All-America candidate had career bests of 11 receptions, 148 yards and three touchdowns in UO's 42-3 romp over the then-No. 6 Golden Bears. His 11 grabs equalled the previous school single-game mark by a tight end, tying **Josh Wilcox**, who had 11 in the 1995 Rose Bowl. Dickson was also one of four nominees for AT&T's All-America Player of the Week.

MORE HONORS FOR DICKSON

SR TE **Ed Dickson** became the first Duck to garner Pac-10 player of the week honors in 2009, winning the offensive award for Week 4 (11 rec, 148 yds, 3 TD vs. Cal, Sept. 26). In addition, he was selected as the John Mackey tight end of the week and the College Football Performance Awards tight end performer of the week. Dickson recorded the second 100-yard receiving game of his career to become the 30th player in school history with multiple century-mark receiving efforts.

IN THE CLASSROOM

No fewer than eight players have either already completed requirements for their undergraduate degrees or are expected to by the end of the coming season. DE **Will Tukuafu**, DB **Titus Jackson** already have earned their degrees while CB **Willie Glasper**, TE **Ed Dickson**, LB **Riley Showalter**, CB **Walter Thurmond III**, DT **Simi Toeaina** and DB **T.J. Ward** are all expected to qualify to graduate no later than the end of the 2009 fall term.

LUCKY NUMBER 7

Few players looked forward to the start of the 2009 season more than **Nate Costa**. On Sept. 12 vs. Purdue, the junior quarterback stepped onto the field for the first time since Nov. 11, 2006, when he completed both of his pass attempts for 22 yards and ran for another 25 yards at USC. Against the Boilermakers, Costa was the holder on five extra-points and two field goal attempts. The Hillmar, Calif., product took his first quarterback snaps of '09 vs. Cal (Sept. 26) and completed his first two passes, running his string of consecutive completions in his career to seven. He missed his first-ever pass on his eighth all-time attempt and finished the game with a line of 4-7-0 for 35 yards. Costa made his first career start at UCLA (Oct. 10) and tossed the first TD pass of his UO tenure in the Ducks' win. In his Oregon career, Costa has suffered two season-ending knee injuries, the last of which occurred just over a week prior to the start of the 2008 season and after he had won the No. 1 QB job in fall camp.

DICKSON NABS RECEIVING MARK

SR TE **Ed Dickson**, an All-America candidate and member of the watch list for the 2009 John Mackey Award recognizing the top tight end in college football, is the top receiver at the position in Oregon history. The senior has 112 career receptions, breaking Josh Wilcox's former mark of 103, and ranks second in receiving yards among tight ends with 1,403.

KELLY ON WATCH LIST

Chip Kelly is one of 20 head coaches named to the Bryant College Football Coach of the Year watch list, selected by the Paul "Bear" Bryant awards committee of the American Heart Association. Bryant College Football Coach of the Year finalists will be announced in December.

FLINT SCORES, DUCKS WIN

SR PK **Morgan Flint** has scored points in 14 of his 16 career appearances - all Oregon victories. Overall, the Ducks are 15-1 when Flint plays and have not lost since his first appearance, Sept. 29, 2007, vs. Cal.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Oregon had seven first-time starters among the 22 players who received opening assignments in the season opener, Sept. 3, at Boise State. On the offense, FR LG **Carson York**, SO TE **David Paulson** and SR RB **LeGarrette Blount** made their first career starts, while on defense, JR DT **Brandon Bair**, SR DT **Blake Ferras**, JR DE **Kenny Rowe** and SO ROV **Javes Lewis** were first-time starters. In addition, specialists **Rob Beard** (FR KO), **Michael Clay** (FR LS) and **Jackson Rice** (FR P), made first team debuts. In Week 2, FR FS **John Boyett** became the eighth Duck to start his first game. Week 3 saw SO LB **Josh Kaddu**, FR RB **LaMichael James** and SO WR **Lavasier Tuinei** make inaugural starts, and in Week 4 JR WR **D.J. Davis** started for the first time. SO CB **Anthony Gildon** started in Week 6 and FR RB **Kenjon Barner** got the nod in Week 8. SO LT **Darrion Weems** became the 15th first-time starter for UO this season in Week 10.

FRESH FACES

In 2007, Oregon ended the year utilizing the services of 10 true freshmen. Last season, that number dropped to five, including current squad members **Garrett Embry** (WR), **Josh Kaddu** (LB), **Dewitt Stuckey** (LB) and **Darron Thomas** (QB). This year, the Ducks have called upon only three newcomers who were preparing for their final high school seasons a year ago: P **Jackson Rice**, from Moraga's (CA) Campolindo High School, LB **Michael Clay**, who joined the Ducks this summer as a linebacker from San Jose's Bellarmine Prep,

and CB **Cliff Harris**, a U.S. Army all-American from Fresno, Calif. (Edison HS).

FRONT AND CENTER

With the departure of three offensive linemen who were keys to last year's offensive success and spent the summer in NFL camps, Oregon's starting interior line entered the season having accumulated a total of only 20 career starting assignments. The defensive line was in a similar situation, returning 24 career starts -- all by DE **Will Tukuafu**. What may be lacking in the number of returning headliners is accounted for in experience in the program. Eight of the 10 offensive linemen in the team's two-deep have already been in the program for a minimum of two seasons.

ROSTER EXPANSION

Following the first game, the Ducks were permitted to expand their roster from 105 to as many as 119 for the remainder of the season and added 11 players. Of the new additions, three took part in spring practices -- JR TE **Sam Doman**, JR OL **Justin Fritz** and SO DL **Nick Musgrove**. Expansion also brings the return of FR RB **Jordan Thompson**, who began fall camp on the 105-man roster, but was sent home due to illness. Spring signee and scholarship student-athlete FR DB **Avery Patterson** is now formally on the squad. He is joined by fellow true freshmen WR **Ben Butterfield** (Sherwood, OR/Sherwood), the younger brother of UO cornerback **Brian Butterfield**, DB **J.R. Maffie**, DE **Andy McIntyre** and DB **Tyler Rittenhour**, a prep teammate of FR P **Jackson Rice**. Rounding out the newcomers are a pair of former junior college players, JR RB **Andres Reed** and JR OL **Josh Sanford**, both from College of the Siskiyous. A second wave of walk-ons arrived in early October, by way of a tryout: De La Salle product FR DB **Mikey Dosen**, wide receivers FR **Dane Ebanes** and FR **Brian Harris**, FR LS **Ned Lyon**, FR RB **Brandon Thurston** and JR DL **Denton Tuiasosopo**, a transfer from FCS school Sacramento State and cousin of current Duck **Simi Toeaina**.

VS. THE TOP 25

It didn't take first-year head coach **Chip Kelly** long to experience his team being tested by a top 25 school as the Ducks drew No. 14 Boise State on the road to open the 2009 campaign. Oregon fell to the Broncos, 19-8, but have since defeated No. 18 Utah, 31-24, No. 6 Cal, 42-3, and No. 4 USC, 47-20, to improve to 3-1. Oregon was 2-1 when facing ranked teams (the week they played them) in 2008.

VS. THE TOP 10

Since 1994, UO is 9-2 at Autzen Stadium against top 10 opposition, including four straight wins dating to 2007.

OREGON CAPTAINS

Seniors **Walter Thurmond III** and **Will Tukuafu**, and juniors **Jordan Holmes** and **Jeremiah Masoli**, have been elected season-long captains following a team vote.

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY

ESPN College GameDay produced its weekly college football preview show from the University of Oregon on Oct. 31, preceding the game vs. No. 4 USC. Overall, the premier college football pre-game show, which has aired weekly on ESPN since its inception in 1989, has made four trips to Eugene. The production's first Oregon appearance occurred in 2000 when it made its first-ever appearance in the Pacific Northwest on Sept. 23 prior to the Oregon-UCLA game. Oregon and UCLA also were featured in 1998 when the show originated from the Rose Bowl in Pasadena. The Ducks are 3-1 when hosting GameDay.

OREGON ALUMS

It speaks well of a program when former players return to their alma mater after they have graduated to fill a role within the athletics department and Oregon has benefitted from an influx of recent returnees. In addition to long-time assistant coaches **Steve Greatwood** and **Don Pellum**, who have both served on the Oregon coaching staff for over 20 years, the Ducks have added four former players in various capacities. Former standout linebacker **Peter Sirmon** (1996-99) begins his first year as one of Oregon graduate assistant coaches. In addition, former defensive backs **Rashad Bauman** (1997-01) and **Matthew Harper** (2006-07) have returned as football interns while wide receiver **Garren Strong** (2004-07) is a recruiting intern.

COACHING CONTINUITY

An overlooked facet of Oregon's success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. Although first-year head coach **Chip Kelly** begins only his third season as part of the Ducks' program and only the school's third head football coach in 33 years, the core of the staff has remained intact over the course of three different head coaches. Running backs coach **Gary Campbell** enters his 27th year on the Oregon staff, which equals the longest tenure of any Oregon assistant football coach in school history. In addition, offensive line coach and running game coordinator **Steve Greatwood** begins his 25th year on the Ducks' coaching staff, linebackers coach **Don Pellum** is in his 22nd season, while defensive coordinator **Nick Aliotti** begins his 19th season at Oregon.

KELLY AT AUTZEN

Head coach **Chip Kelly** made his sideline debut at Autzen Stadium in the home opener Sept. 12 (W 38-36) after spending the past two seasons calling plays from a booth high above the field as the team's offensive coordinator. Since Kelly's arrival in 2007, the Ducks are 15-3 at Autzen, averaging 41.1 points per home game.

TV APPEARANCES

Oregon has been selected for at least ten out-of-market television appearances this season: Sept. 3 at Boise State (ESPN), Sept. 12 vs. Purdue (FSN), Sept. 19 vs. Utah (ESPN), Sept. 26 vs. Cal (ABC), Oct. 10 at UCLA (ABC), Oct. 24 at Washington (ABC), Oct. 31 vs. USC (ABC/ESPN2), Nov. 7 at Stanford (FSN), Nov. 14 vs. Arizona State (FSN or Versus) and Dec. 3 vs. Oregon State (ESPN).

HOT COMMODITIES

For only the third time in school history, Oregon has sold over 43,000 football season tickets, with ticket sales topping the 43,200 mark. That total is slightly below the 43,242 figure from 2007 while the Ducks sold 44,182 season tickets a year ago. Single-game reserved seats have been exhausted for the home game vs. Oregon State (Dec. 3), while only scattered seats remain for the contest against Arizona State (Nov. 14).

PICK-6 TIMES III

SR CB **Walter Thurmond III** recorded the third interception return for a touchdown of his career in UO's Sept. 12 win vs. Purdue, placing him in a three-way tie with **Rashad Bauman** (1997-01) and **Kenny Wheaton** (1994-96) for the most in school history. Thurmond is also tied with Tennessee's **Eric Berry**, Florida's **Brandon Spikes** and UCLA's **Alterraun Verner** for the most Pick-6 touchdowns by active NCAA FBS players.

THURMOND SETS TD MARK

Since the era of two-platoon football was re-established in the college game for good in 1965, no Oregon defensive player has accounted for more touchdowns than SR CB **Walter Thurmond III**. The senior has broken the plane of the end zone five times – one fumble return for a touchdown vs. Fresno State ('07), interceptions against South Florida ('07), Oregon State ('08) and Purdue ('09), as well as punt return for a score vs. Utah ('09). Prior to Thurmond, cornerback **Michael Fletcher** (1996-99) held the unofficial record for most touchdowns by a non-offensive player – four (one fumble return in 1997, two punt returns in '98 and a punt return in '99).

HOUSE OF LOUD

With five home crowds beyond capacity so far this season, including a State of Oregon record 59,529 vs. USC on Halloween, Oregon has sold out Autzen Stadium (cap. 54,000) for 66 consecutive games, dating to 1999.

BYE LOVE

With its victory at Washington Oct. 24, Oregon improved to 17-2 in the regular season when coming off a bye week since 1995. The Ducks only two setbacks came vs. Washington in 1996 and at Arizona in 2007.

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — Four quarters of getting flustered by the guys in blue finally made Oregon's LeGarrette Blount snap.

Not only is No. 16 Oregon heading home after getting bullied around by No. 14 Boise State, but the Ducks must wonder what will happen to their punch-throwing running

back.

Kellen Moore threw for 197 yards and a touchdown and Boise State pushed around Oregon 19-8 on Thursday night, turning the Broncos' biggest home game ever into a four-quarter party.

That is until the closing moments when Blount lost his cool and punched Boise State's Byron Hout, then needed to be restrained by police and team staff to keep from going after fans.

"I just apologize to anyone watching that," Blount said. "I just apologize to all of our fans and all of Boise's fans. That's something I shouldn't have done. I lost my head."

As the Broncos began celebrating on their famous blue turf, Hout yelled in Blount's face and tapped him on the shoulder pad. That drew an immediate scream from Boise State head coach Chris Petersen, but before Petersen could pull Hout away, Blount landed a right hand to the defensive end's jaw.

"I tell you what, that will never happen again," Blount continued. "I will never lose my head again. ... I should have handled that situation a lot better than I did."

If not for two missed field goals, a botched field-goal snap and three turnovers, it very well might have been a high-scoring rout for the Broncos.

They outgained Oregon 361 to 152, rolling up 22 first downs to the Ducks' six. The struggles of Kelly's offense were stunning, considering Oregon scored a combined 162 points in its final three games of 2008 and brought quarterback Jeremiah Masoli back to run the show.

The total yards were the fewest for Oregon in nearly 15 years. Oregon had the ball for 17 minutes, 28 seconds and didn't get its first first down until the 7:07 mark of the third quarter.

EUGENE (AP) — Oregon put suspended running back LeGarrette Blount and Boise State behind them by holding off Purdue 38-36 on Saturday night.

Trailing 38-30, the Boilermakers' Keith Smith found Aaron Valentin with a 15-yard touchdown pass with 1:01 left. But Kyle Adams

caught Joey Elliott's pass to tie it out of bounds as Oregon (1-1) eked out the victory. Purdue (1-1) had closed within one at 31-30 early in the fourth quarter on Ralph Bolden's 22-yard touchdown reception. Oregon's Kenjon Barner then ran 21 yards for a score with 6:42 left.

The Ducks couldn't capitalize on Casey Matthews' interception on the Oregon 23 and had to settle for a 28-yard field goal from Morgan Flint to go up 3-0 early in the first quarter.

The Boilermakers came back with a quick drive that ended with Jaycen Taylor's 5-yard run to take the lead, but Oregon's Andre Crenshaw capped an equally quick drive with a 2-yard TD dash and the Ducks were ahead 10-7.

Bolden, who rushed for 234 yards in Purdue's season-opening victory over Toledo, had a 14-yard touchdown run early in the second quarter to put the Boilermakers back in front.

Oregon went up 17-14 on Walter Thurmond III's 18-yard interception return before Purdue tied it up just before halftime on Carson Wiggs' 23-yard field goal.

Purdue took back the lead on Bolden's 1-yard leap into the end zone early in the second half. But then a fumble was scooped up by Javes Lewis, who ran 28 yards for the score to tie it again for the Ducks.

That appeared to spark the Ducks, and Jeremiah Masoli scored on a keeper from 15 yards out. Just as he scored, a rainstorm hit Autzen and the deciding fourth quarter was marked by periodic showers.

Masoli completed 11 of 21 passes for 163 yards for Oregon. Elliott went 24 of 41 for 266 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions for Purdue.

Bolden finished with 123 yards. Masoli led the Ducks' rushers with 84 yards.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- LaMichael James rushed for 152 yards and a touchdown, and John Boyett made a crucial interception to help Oregon beat No. 14 Utah 31-24 on Saturday and snap the nation's longest winning streak.

The Utes (2-1) had won 16 straight, including their 31-17 upset of Alabama in the Sugar Bowl last January. Their last loss was on Nov. 24, 2007, at BYU.

Oregon quarterback Jeremiah Masoli also ran for two touchdowns, but had two fumbles and an interception in the second half that allowed Utah to rally from a 21-7 deficit to within 28-24 by the end of the third quarter.

An interception by linebacker Eddie Pleasant set up a 31-yard field goal by Morgan Flint with 3:30 left in the game, giving the Ducks (2-1) a 31-24 lead. The Utes drove to the Oregon 37 with under two minutes to play, but Boyett picked off a pass from Terrence Cain at the 5 to preserve the victory.

Cain finished 20 of 41 for 178 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. He also had 68 yards on the ground, but didn't get much help from an offense that struggled to move the ball all game. Matt Asiata managed only 54 yards on 15 carries.

Oregon's Walter Thurmond III returned a punt 78 yards following a three-and-out on Utah's opening drive to put the Ducks ahead 7-0 at raucous Autzen Stadium. It was Thurmond's fifth career touchdown and second of the season, after the defensive back scored on an interception return last week against Purdue.

Utah tied it at the 6:34 mark of the first quarter on a 19-yard run by Cain, the drive set up by a blocked punt on fourth-and-20 at the Ducks 24. Elijah Wesson, a reserve wide receiver, appeared to get a hand on Jackson Rice's kick, then snatched the deflected ball out of the air.

One play later, Cain scored his first rushing TD of the season.

The Ducks went back ahead 14-7 with 57 seconds left in the first quarter on a 3-yard run by James, two plays after Masoli hit Jeff Maehl on a 58-yard completion. The lead swelled to 21-7 on a 22-yard run by Masoli with 4:39 left in the first half.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Jeremiah Masoli answered his doubters by throwing for 253 yards and three touchdowns in Oregon's 42-3 upset of sixth-ranked California on Saturday.

Masoli went into the game without a scoring pass this season, prompting Ducks fans

to call for his benching. But he responded by completing 21 of 25 passes for the Ducks (3-1), who had 524 yards in total offense to Cal's 206 yards.

Tailback Jahvid Best ran for just 55 yards for the Golden Bears (3-1). Widely considered a top Heisman contender, Best went into the game ranked third in the nation with an average of 137.33 yards on the ground.

Oregon tight end Ed Dickson had 11 catches for a career-best 148 yards. He caught all three of Masoli's scoring passes.

Cal scored on Vince D'Amato's 47-yard field goal early after Oregon fumbled on its opening kickoff return.

The Golden Bears would not score again.

Oregon tied it with Morgan Flint's 30-yard field goal. Masoli completed five passes on the scoring drive - surpassing the four completions he had last weekend in Oregon's 31-24 victory over then-No. 18 Utah.

Despite the win, Masoli was widely criticized for his performance and many suggested the Ducks go with backup Nate Costa against Cal. Oregon first-year coach Chip Kelly was steadfast in support of Masoli.

His first touchdown pass of the season was a 26-yard strike to Dickson that opened the second quarter. Masoli then tossed to Flint, who scampered into the end zone for the conversion to put the Ducks up 11-3.

After D'Amato missed a 43-yard attempt, Oregon pushed its lead to 18-3 on Remene Alston's 1-yard TD dive. LaMichael James ran for a 4-yard touchdown just before halftime to make it 25-3.

James finished with 21 carries for 118 yards.

In the third quarter, Dickson caught scoring passes of nine and 36 yards from Masoli as Oregon went up 39-3. Ironically, fans who called for Costa got their wish when Masoli left the game early in the fourth quarter.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Jeremiah Masoli threw for 116 yards and a touchdown and ran for another score before sitting out the second half in No. 16 Oregon's 52-6 victory over Washington State on Saturday night.

Ed Dickson had seven catches for 103 yards and a score for the Ducks (4-1, 2-0

Pacific-10) who won their fourth straight after a season-opening loss at Boise State.

The Cougars (1-4, 0-3) were held to 139 yards of offense. Oregon had 505 yards. Freshman quarterback Jeff Tuel made his first start but completed just one of two passes in the first quarter before he was knocked out by a hard sack. He had a hip pointer and did not return.

Oregon built a 21-0 lead in the first quarter and the rout was on. LaMichael James got it started for the Ducks with a 26-yard touchdown run less than two minutes into the game. After Masoli found Ed Dickson with a 26-yard scoring pass, James added a 3-yard TD run to make it 21-0.

Tuel, who showed promise in relief last weekend in the Cougars' 27-6 loss at USC, was shaky in his first start in front of Autzen's notoriously loud crowd. He was sacked twice. The second, by Oregon's Will Tukuafu, knocked Tuel out of the game. He was replaced by Marshall Lobbestael, who was limited by a sore left knee. Washington State wide receiver Jared Karstetter also sat out the second half with a hip pointer.

Masoli scored on a 1-yard keeper before Andre Crenshaw's 6-yard touchdown dash. Nate Costa, who replaced Masoli midway through the second quarter, scored on a 4-yard run just before halftime to make it 42-0.

After Morgan Flint kicked a 40-yard field goal for the Ducks, Lobbestael's 1-yard keeper for Washington State late in the third quarter made it 45-6.

Remene Alston scored for Oregon on a 6-yard run to open the final quarter.

Dickson has 104 career catches, surpassing Josh Wilcox for most career receptions for an Oregon tight end. Wilcox (1993-96) had 103.

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) -- Kenjon Barner returned the second-half kickoff for a 100-yard touchdown, and Talmadge Jackson returned an interception 32 yards for another score just 13 seconds later in No. 13 Oregon's 24-10 victory over UCLA on Saturday.

Jeff Maehl took a short reception 20 yards for the Ducks' third touchdown in less than four minutes during a spectacular opening to the second half of their fifth straight win.

Oregon's big plays on special teams and defense covered for an offense that was shut out in the first half, struggling without injured quarterback Jeremiah Masoli.

Nate Costa passed for just 82 yards in his first career start as the Ducks (5-1, 3-0 Pac-10) trailed 3-0 at halftime to the Bruins, whose offense also flailed. Oregon stayed out of trouble late by running the ball on its final 19 plays.

Kevin Prince was 13 of 25 for just 81 yards in his return from a two-game injury absence for the Bruins (3-2, 0-2), who have lost two straight while scoring just one offensive touchdown. Prince also lost a fumble and threw an interception before third-string freshman Richard Brehaut took over for parts of the fourth quarter, passing for 64 yards.

Akeem Ayers made an astonishing interception in Oregon's end zone for the Bruins' only touchdown late in the third quarter, leaping to snag Costa's pass as the quarterback tumbled out of bounds, then tucking his own feet inbounds as he fell.

LaMichael James rushed for 152 yards for the Ducks, who had scored 94 points in their previous two games. Both teams' offenses floundered for much of the afternoon at the Rose Bowl, but Oregon showed it doesn't need much offense to stay on top of the Pac-10.

The Ducks hadn't scored in eight consecutive quarters at the Rose Bowl before Barner, a freshman backup running back, took the second-half kickoff in his own end zone and burst through the wedge. He sprinted to Oregon's first TD on a kickoff return since Jonathan Stewart did it Nov. 19, 2005.

On the Bruins' next snap, Jackson jumped Terrence Austin's buttonhook route and ran unimpeded to the end zone for Oregon's second score.

SEATTLE (AP) -- Jeremiah Masoli returned from a knee injury to run for two scores, No. 12 Oregon blocked a punt for a touchdown and used a fake field goal to set up another TD, and the Ducks overwhelmed border rival Washington 43-19 on Saturday.

Oregon extended its dominance of Washington to six straight - longest in the history of the series - and like the previous five this one wasn't close. Oregon took advantage of Washington's mistakes and the Ducks' defense forced three turnovers, corralled Jake Locker and didn't let the Huskies into the end zone until the fourth quarter.

All six wins in the Ducks streak have been by more than 20 points.

Unlike their last outing two weeks ago at UCLA, the Ducks (6-1, 4-0 Pac-10) got their offense moving. Masoli was a spectator against the Bruins and Oregon needed a kickoff return for a score and an interception return for another TD to get the win.

Last week's open date gave Masoli time to heal and with it Oregon got back its engine. His running ability kept Washington's defense guessing all day whether Masoli was keeping the run or handing off to his stable of shifty backs.

When needed, Masoli's passing was on point. And the frantic speed Oregon calls plays exposed Washington's lack of defensive depth.

Masoli completed 14 of 22 throws for 157 yards and a touchdown. He also added TD runs of 1 and 3 yards as part of his 54 yards rushing.

LaMichael James, the workhorse of Oregon's ground attack since LeGarrette Blount's suspension, rushed for 154 yards and a pair of touchdowns, including a 56-yard TD sprint in the fourth quarter to cap this Oregon party.

While Oregon's offense found its rhythm, Locker and the Huskies could never solve Oregon's mix of blitzes and pressures. Locker was sacked four times and when he was able to get throws off his receivers didn't help with a handful of drops.

Locker completed 23 of 44 for 266 and two interceptions.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Jeremiah Masoli threw for 222 yards and a touchdown and ran for 164 more yards with another score and No. 10 Oregon ran past No. 4 Southern California 47-20 Saturday night, the Trojans' worst loss since 1997.

Redshirt freshman LaMichael James ran for 183 yards and a score as the Ducks (7-1, 5-0 Pacific-10) racked up 391 yards on the ground against the Trojans, who came into the game with the fifth-best rush defense in the nation, allowing an average of just 79.9 yards a game.

Southern California (6-2, 3-2) had not lost a game by more than a touchdown since a 27-16 loss to Notre Dame in 2001, Pete Carroll's first season as Trojans coach. It was USC's worst loss since a 35-7 defeat to Arizona State on Oct. 11, 1997 and the most points allowed by the Trojans in Carroll's tenure.

USC freshman quarterback Matt Barkley, who earlier in the week predicted he would feed off Autzen's deafening noise, completed 21 of 38 passes for 187 yards and two scores. He was intercepted once.

Masoli completed 19 of 31 for Oregon, which had never before scored as many points against the Trojans.

USC went up 3-0 on the its first series of the game on Jordan Congdon's 28-yard field goal. Oregon answered with Morgan Flint's 32-yarder, but the Ducks had squandered their opportunity after Kenjon Barner's 77-yard kickoff return.

Masoli scored on a 3-yard run to put the Ducks up 10-3 late in the first quarter. USC tied it with Barkley's 3-yard pass to Ronald Johnson early in the second.

Oregon went ahead again on Andre Crenshaw's 1-yard scoring run. And USC tied it again at 17 on Barkley's 4-yard pass to Damian Williams.

Masoli found Jamere Holland with a 17-yard touchdown pass to put the Ducks back up 24-17 at the half.

From that point, USC couldn't keep up.
