- 1. The Ducks kicked off the 2013 season with the most decisive season-opening victory since 2003 after defeating Portland 3-0 on Friday.
- 2. For the first time in program history, Oregon forced 15th-ranked perennial power Portland into overtime. The Pilots prevailed, 2-1, in the closest decision between the two schools since a 1-0 decision in 2003.
- 3. Oregon had a Papè Field record crowd in attendance during Sunday's game against the Pilots. A crowd of 1,098 watched the Ducks force Portland into overtime in a thriller.
- **4.** Through two games, the Ducks have a statistical advantage in goals scored (4-2). shots (30-21), shots on goal (11-8), corner kicks (13-8) and shot percentage (.133-.095).
- 5. The Ducks have shown impressive balance on offense this season, as four players lead Oregon with two points (Miner, Beutler, Davie, Strawn), while two players have tallied one point (Pugh, Archer).
- 6. Head coach Kat Mertz has gotten the most of her substitutes this season as 18 players have seen playing time, while 12 of those players have logged over 90 minutes. Three of the six players who have tallied points have done so off the bench.
- **7.** Freshman ShayLee Miner scored Oregon's first goal of the 2013 season in her first career game. Miner scored in the 44th minute against Portland State.
- **8.** Hometown product Ashlee Schulz, a freshman from Springfield, started in both of Oregon's first two games at center back.
- 9. Junior goalkeeper Abby Steele collected her ninth career shutout against Portland State. Steele has a 0.99 GAA this season and has made six saves.
- **10.** Sophomore Maryn Beutler showed impressive range on Friday, scoring a cracker of a goal from 30 yards out against Portland State.
- Oregon will be meeting both Wisconsin and Texas on the pitch for the first time in program history. The Ducks are 0-3-0 against the Big Ten and 3-4-0 against the Big

Fans can receive a discounted ticket price if they bring a ticket stub from Saturday's Oregon athletic events. Tickets are \$2 if accompanied with an Oregon Classic volleyball ticket stub or a Nicholls football ticket stub.

#### **SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS**

Wisconsin opened the season with consecutive road games, and the Badgers cruised to wins in both. Wisconsin defeated Connecticut 3-2 and Illinois State 4-1 last week. Wisconsin is led by Cara Walls with three goals. Head coach Paula Wilkins and Wisconsin return nine starters from 2012's team that went 12-8-1.

For the first time in program history, Oregon forced perennial power Portland into overtime. After a first half goal from the Pilots, Oregon's Ryann Davie scored a 69th-minute goal to level the game. Portland scored three minutes into the first overtime period. It was Oregon's closest decision to Portland since a 1-0 loss in 2003.

#### **RECORD CROWD AT PAPÈ FIELD**

A Papè Field record crowd of 1,098 fans were in attendance for Oregon's thrilling match against No. 15 Portland, the largest crowd in the stadium's history. Of the four Pac-12 teams to play at home this season, Oregon's average attendance (960) ranks second.

#### STATS FARE WELL FOR DUCKS

Oregon's impressive opening week of play showed up in the stat book, as Oregon leads its opponents in; goals (4-2), shots (30-21), shot percentage (.133-.095), shots on goal (11-8), shots per game (15-10.5) and corner kicks (13-8). The Ducks rank third in the Pac-12 in corners, fourth in goals and points, and fifth in shots.

#### STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Oregon's 2013 schedule includes seven opponents ranked or receiving votes in the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Poll -- Stanford (2), UCLA (5), BYU (6), California (20), Portland (22), USC (RV) and Arizona State (RV). Five Oregon opponents are ranked in the top-25 of the most recent TopDrawerSoccer Poll.

#### **BALANCE IN ATTACK**

The Oregon attack has been a team effort through two games, with four players leading the team with two points from a goal and two players leading with one point from an assist. ShayLee Miner, Maryn Beutler, Ryann Davie and Brooke Strawn have each scored a goal, while Bri Pugh and Lilly Archer each tallied an assist.

#### MINER MAKES BRILLIANT FIRST IMPRESSION

Freshman ShayLee Miner made the most of her collegiate debut, scoring 18 minutes and 13 seconds after subbing on in the 25th minute. The Ducks earned a corner in the 44th minute, and Lilly Archer's well-hit cross found Miner in the box. Miner scored from six yards out. Miner leads Oregon and ranks tied for sixth in the Pac-12 in shots (6).

#### **BANGER FROM BEUTLER**

Sophomore Maryn Beutler scored a goal that will likely be one of the highlight strikes of the season against Portland State. Beutler had space and time in the midfield, and decided to test a forward Viking goalkeeper. Beutler's cracker from 30 yards out hit the top, right corner of the net in the final goal of the game.

#### **STEELE CURTAIN**

Junior goalkeeper Abby Steele collected her ninth career shutout in Oregon's season opening victory over Portland State. Steele ranks fourth in program history in shutouts (9) and tied for fifth in wins (11) after the victory. Steele made four vital saves in Oregon's thrilling match against No. 15 Portland. She has a 0.99 GAA and a .750 save percentage this season

#### **DUCKS RELOAD OFFENSIVE TALENT**

Oregon returns five of its top-six leading scorers from 2012, including Kristen Parr, who totaled 14 points off seven goals. Bri Pugh (6 points), Achijah Berry (4), Maryn Beutler (3) and Kira Wagoner (3) also return after successful 2012 campaigns.

#### **OREGON WELCOMES NEW STAFF**

The University of Oregon women's soccer team opened a new era this season with the introduction of head coach Kat Mertz and a brand new coaching staff. Assistant coaches Hideki Nakada and Christie Welsh round out Mertz's staff.

Mertz spent the last season at Saint Louis, and also has collegiate coaching experience at Texas (assistant), UNLV, UCLA (assistant) and Virginia (assistant). On top of her 54-48-20 collegiate coaching record, Mertz was been a major part of the United States Women's Youth National Teams.

Nakada spent the last four seasons as an assistant coach at Marquette University. Nakada is a graduate of San Francisco and a three-year veteran of the Japan J-Léague first and second division. Welsh joins Mert'z staff after spending last season as an assistant at St. Joseph's. Welsh, a former Hermann Trophy winner and U.S. National Team member, was one of the most decorated players in Penn State and Big Ten history.

#### **NEXT ON THE SCHEDULE**

Oregon returns to action Sept. 6, hosting Hawai'i at Papè Field. Start time is set for 4 p.m. (PT). The Ducks return to the pitch two days later, hosting UC Irvine on Sunday at 1 p.m. (PT).

#### **HEAD COACH KAT MERTZ**

Kat Mertz was named head women's soccer coach at the University of Oregon on Dec. 21, 2012. Mertz brings extensive coaching experience with her from successful NCAA coaching tenures and experience on the U.S. Women's National Youth Team's coaching staffs.

Mertz comes to UO after spending the 2012 season as head coach at Saint Louis University. Mertz is the third coach in UO history since the program was returned to the varsity level in 1996.

She replaces Tara Erickson who coached from 2005-12 and registered an eight-year mark of 70-71-18 (20-46-10 Pac-10/12). Bill Steffen preceded Erickson, amassing a nine-year record of 49-107-14 (15-51-6 Pac-10) from 1996-2004. Mertz has made nine NCAA Tournament appearances in five collegiate coaching stints covering 14 seasons.

She also has extensive coaching experience with the U.S. Women's Youth National Team and the Olympic Development Program. Among her highlights with the USWYNT is a 2008 FIFA World Cup Championship with the U-20 squad in Chile.

Prior to taking over at Saint Louis where she led the Billikens to a 5-9-4 record, Mertz served as an assistant coach at Texas and helped guide the Longhorns to the NCAA Tournament in 2010 and 2011. Texas placed nine student-athletes on the All-Big 12 squad and 19 on the Academic All-Conference team during her tenure.

She was also a head coach at UNLV where she spent five seasons from 2005-09. Mertz compiled a 49-39-19 record and led the Rebels to a pair of NCAA Tournament berths, winning back-to-back Mountain West Conference Tournament titles in 2005 and 2006 en route to the postseason. She was named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Rebels to the MWC regular-season crown in 2007.

Mertz coached 17 All-Conference performers at UNLV, including an MWC co-Offensive Player of the Year, and three All-Region honorees. During her five seasons, the Rebels produced 60 Academic All-Conference selections, three College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District choices and one CoSIDA Academic All-American.

She has familiarity with the Pac-12 Conference; Mertz was the lead assistant coach at UCLA for five years (2000-04). The Bruins reached the NCAA Tournament round of 16 in each of those seasons and advanced to the NCAA College Cup in 2000, 2003 and 2004. UCLA won three Pac-10 championships and produced numerous All-Americans, Pac-10 Players of the Year and Academic All-Americans during Mertz's time with the program.

Mertz started her collegiate coaching career at Virginia where she was an assistant coach for the 1999

A member of the U.S. Women's National Team's U-20 and U-18 coaching staff since 2007, Mertz helped lead the U-20 squad to the 2008 FIFA World Cup title. The United States advanced from the group stage with a 2-0-1 record, before defeating England (3-0 and Germany (1-0) in the knockout stage. Mertz and the United States knocked off North Korea, 2-1, in the final to claim the championship.

She was an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team's U-15 team in its inaugural season in 2004, and last year she became a national scout for the Youth National Team programs.

Mertz served as head coach of the Olympic Development Program Region IV '94 age group team and was the ODP Region IV assistant director of goalkeeping from 2004 to 2010.

Mertz was a four-year starting goalkeeper (1994-97) at North Carolina State, where she helped the Wolfpack qualify for three NCAA Tournaments and reach the 1995 national quarterfinals. A starter in 88 of a possible 90 matches, she owns school records for saves in a career (436) and season (135, 1994) and ranks third in career shutouts (24).

Following her collegiate career, Mertz played two seasons for the Raleigh Wings, a W-1 (top tier) team in the United Soccer Leagues W-League. The Wings were league champions both years.

Mertz earned a bachelor's degree in natural resources, ecosystem assessment, at North Carolina State in 1998. She holds a United States Soccer Federation "A" national coaching license and a National Soccer Coaches Association of America Advanced National Diploma.
